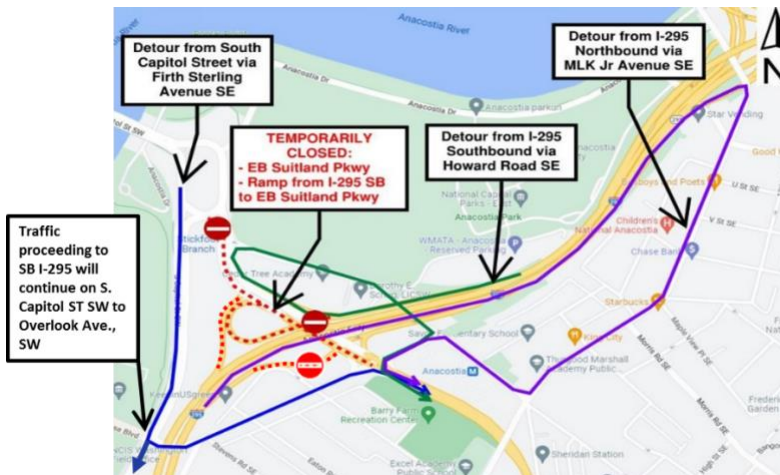

Temporary Closures Eastbound Suitland Parkway, from August 29 to September 02, 2022

(Washington, DC) - The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) will temporarily close eastbound Suitland Parkway between South Capitol St SE and Firth Sterling Avenue SE nightly from August 29 to September 05, between 9.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. the following morning. When eastbound Suitland Parkway is closed, traffic will be detoured via southbound South Capitol Street to Overlook Avenue SW to access southbound I-295 or turn left on Firth Sterling Avenue SE to access Suitland Parkway. Ramp traffic from (1) I-295 southbound to Suitland Parkway will be detoured via Howard Road SE and Firth Sterling Avenue SE; and (2) I-295 northbound to Suitland Parkway will continue on I-295 and exit at Exit 5C to Martin Luther King Jr Avenue SE. Marked detour will be in place during closures.

These closures are necessary for construction activities associated with the South Capitol Street Corridor Project which includes construction of the New Frederick Douglass Memorial Bridge and the reconstruction of the I-295/Suitland Parkway interchange.

Please observe the posted speed limit and proceed through the construction area with caution. Pedestrians and cyclists are advised to stay alert and follow signage when traveling through this area.
