DDOT Traffic Advisory: Temporary Closures on I-295 Northbound and Southbound January 24th – January 30th, 2022

(Washington, DC)—The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) will temporarily close a lane on the following roadway to perform construction activities along the I-295/DC 295 corridor from Monday, January 24th, 2022, until Sunday, January 30th, 2022, weather permitting:

I-295 Northbound: Laboratory Road / US Naval Research Lab (Exit 1) to Suitland Parkway / JBAB (Exit 3A)

- Left or right shoulder closure between Exits 1-3 starting at 9:00am to 4:00pm from January 24th to January 29th
- Single left or right lane closure between Exits 1-3 starting at 9:00am to 4:00am from January 24th to January 29th
- Single left or right lane closure between Exits 1-3 starting at 9:00am to 2:00pm from January 29th to January 30th

I-295 Southbound: Suitland Parkway / JBAB (Exit 3A) to Laboratory Road / US Naval Research Lab (Exit 1)

• Single left or right lane closure between Exits 1-3 starting at 7:00am to 4:00pm from January 24th to January 29th

Additional Work:

- Single left or right lane closure on Malcolm X Ave SE westbound from 2nd St. to South Capitol Street SE starting at 7:00am to 4:30pm from January 24th to January 29th
- Single left or right lane closure on Malcolm X Ave SE eastbound South Capitol to/from 2nd Street SE starting at 6:00am to 4:30pm from January 24th to January 29th

All traffic controls will be in place to warn drivers approaching the areas. Motorists should anticipate moderate delays due to the lane is closure. Drivers are advised to stay alert while traveling through these locations and to be observant of the inspection and construction personnel.
